

about the fuel system. He does not want water in the fuel, and doesn't want it to be dangerous. It could use some sprucing up but otherwise he is OK with our maintenance of it.

100 LL Replacement Fuel Report — Earl Brosman reports that Swift Fuels in Lafayette received approval for their 100LL replacement fuel and will be licensing the manufacturing process. Shell also has approval for their fuel. No word on pricing or availability for either fuel was mentioned at this time.

Propane Report — Chad Williams reported that by pre-buying propane for this coming winter the club gets the lowest price. We were \$800 under budget for propane last year, so we only needed to buy \$150 in propane this time. The price came out to about \$1.30 per gallon.

INDOT Inspection — Chad Williams reported the INDOT made their inspection of the airport a couple of weeks ago. The inspector stated that one of the wind socks was faded and needed to be replaced, plus they were unable to verify that the runway lights were working due to their daytime inspection. Chad replaced the windsock and sent night time photos to verify that the airport is in compliance.

Trash Report — Although the club has cancelled the trash dumpster, it is still on the property and is now full. We may owe for one more service charge. Members are asked to either burn their trash in the receptacle on the north row of hangars, haul their trash home, or bag it and leave by the Operations Building propane tank.

Upcoming Projects — Ray Rice would like to compile a list of things that need to be done to maintain the property. The airport owner wants the fence along the front replaced. He would like simple posts with a chain through them. We may organize a fence work crew this year. The club needs to address the weeds coming through the runway and between the hangars. Ron Lehrmand sprayed the runway and ramp, improving the appearance but more spraying and weed-eater work needs to be done. Ray would like for the club to buy rubber landscaping disks to place around the runway lights, which would eliminate the need for spray and/or weed-eaters around the lights. Jay Schaumburg will research the costs. The Operations Building is in good shape, however, the interior could use some sprucing up. The rooms could use some painting. Ray would like to see the lending library cleaned up or removed. Members are asked to take home books and magazines.

Volunteer Report — The members present discussed how it appears that 20% of the club does 80% of the work. The discussion revolved around work incentives and its relationship with hangar rental costs. No action was taken on this subject.

Adjournment — Chad Williams motioned to adjourn; Jay Schaumburg seconded. The meeting was adjourned.
